Mrs Hansen was referred to me with a left breast lump and a suspicious-looking 2x2cm mass on mammography on 14 May 2018. A core biopsy revealed an invasive ductal carcinoma with lymphatic invasion. It was ER/PR/HER-2 positive on immunohistochemistry.

Mrs Hansen proceeded to have an elective left mastectomy and left axillary clearance on 27 May 2018. A staging CT was performed prior to this procedure showing some left axilla lymphadenopathy but no distal metastasis. The histopathology again confirmed a moderately-to-poorly-differentiated invasive ductal carcinoma with 9 involved axillary lymph nodes.

Mrs Hansen's mother was diagnosed at age 50 with breast cancer which required a mastectomy. She is a retired school teacher who lives with her husband in Wallsend. She is not taking any regular medication and had no other relevant medical history.

Please consider seeing Mrs Hansen for further advice and management of her newly-diagnosed breast cancer.
