Dear Doctor,

Re: Mr Geoff Hendricks

Thank you for agreeing to see Mr Hendricks. He is a 55-year-old male who has presented with a two-day history of frank haematuria with right flank discomfort, without dysuria or febrile symptoms. He reports no history of trauma, he has no known renal tract abnormalities. He has also had 6kg unintentional weight loss over the preceding four months.

Mr Hendricks has a 60-pack year smoking history, and continues to smoke 1.5 packs per day. He drinks approximately 8-10 schooners of beer per night

On examination Mr Hendricks has some discomfort to deep palpation of the right flank with no palpable masses. Abdominal examination was otherwise unremarkable. Dipstick of urine sample demonstrated blood +++.

Mr Hendricks was investigated with a well-defined lobulated mass infiltrating the right kidney and compressing liver and IVC with ?renal vein thrombosis.

Mr Hendricks has a history of well-controlled hypertension and asthma. He had a right total hip replacement in 2014 following a fall from a horse. He has no other health concerns and NKDA.

I would appreciate your assistance in the further investigation and management of Mr. Hendricks.
