History of Present Illness

Mr Winters was recently an inpatient at ARRH Surgical ward due to an epistaxis. He attended the emergency department on the 7th of September, and was admitted under my care.

Mr Winters had an anterior epistaxis of which he lost approx. 4 cups of blood with associated drop in Hb. Management of this was complicated by his anticoagulation for prosthetic mitral valve and hypertension.

His bleeding stopped with rapid rhino insertion, left in situ for 72 hours. He received 1L of Hartman's solution and a blood transfusion while under my care. On discharge, Mr Winters' anterior epistaxis had ceased and his hemodynamic status had stabilised.

Hospital Course

1. Anterior epistaxis

Rapid rhino was inserted and left in situ for 72 hours with antibiotic coverage,

cephalexin 500mg BD, and analgesia, PRN panadol 1g QID

2. Anticoagulation reversal

Consultation with patient's regular cardiologist resulted in reversal of

anticoagulation with prothrombinex.

Warfarin was discontinued

3. Hypovolaemia

IV Hartmans 1L in Emergency Department

Blood transfusion on surgical ward

Discharge Medications

Warfarin was discontinued. The rest of the medications to be continued as suggested.

Discharge Instructions (diet, activity, discharged to home/nursing facility, etc)

Please recommence patient on warfarin, aiming for INR 2-3

Please retest FBC, for haemoglobin and haematocrit.

Please provide Mr. Winters with a new referral to take to his cardiologist on the follow-

up appointment.
