# **Expressions of Interest for PSYC533 supervisors**

## (paid causal positions)

### The role:

As an accredited supervisor, you will be involved in the delivery of individual and group clinical supervision via an online platform to UNE Masters of Psychology trainees. Supervision of professional practice is mandated in the training of psychologists and is intended to serve 3 functions: (1) monitoring and ensuring client well-being and evaluating supervisee competencies; (2) supporting supervisee personal and professional well-being; and (3) educating and guiding supervisee's professional practice.

### Duration:

The 15-week unit runs in both Trimester 1 and Trimester 2 (approx. late Feb- early June, and late June to early October)

#### Supervisor Responsibilities:

- Provide weekly 2hr group supervision session with approximately 6 supervisees at a time of your choosing, typically during UNE business hours (9am-5pm AEST);
- Provide 1hr monthly individual supervision to supervisees in the form of 1:1 supervision at a time of your choosing (typically during UNE business hours);
- Provide individual supervision to supervisees by reviewing supervisee's client session recordings, clinical records and evaluating supervisee competencies, at a time of your choosing;
- Be available for one day to conduct the Observed Structured Clinical Examination (OSCE) for each of the OSCE examinations (usually held in approx. Week 4 and Week 14 of placement)
- Attend five x 1hr online Peer Supervision sessions with fellow supervisors and a member of UNE's Placement Coordination team during UNE business hours;
- Familiarise oneself with the unit content and prepare for all tasks.

## **Time Commitment:**

A total of 110 hours over the course of the unit; hourly requirements are variable from week to week but average 6 hours/wk (see sample timetable for more information)
